

What is Buccal Midazolam?



Where do I get Buccal Midazolam?




You can only get this medication with a prescription.

The doctor or consultant

- Will ask you questions about your health
- May also check your blood pressure
- Will ask you if you are taking other medication

How do I take Buccal Midazolam?



You will have a care plan which will tell your carer when to give you buccal midazolam medicine.

Your carer will give you the medicine in your mouth when you need it.



What is good about Buccal Midazolam?



Buccal midazolam can help if you have problems with your seizures.

It works quickly to stop your seizures.

It is easy to give you even when you are having a seizure.

It is easy to carry when you are out in the community.



What is not good about Buccal Midazolam?

There are some health problems that people can get when they take buccal midazolam medicine. These problems are called side effects but not everyone gets them.
 Having a headache Feeling very tired Problems remembering things Feeling dizzy and faint Feeling confused Feeling unsteady on your feet
 You should speak to your doctor if you: Have a rash on their skin Feel more angry Feel unwell

What other things do I need to talk to the doctor about?

You should talk to your doctor You are worried about You want to know how when taking medicatio You are planning to ha	taking the medicine. / much alcohol is safe to drink on.
