What is Haloperidol?

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Haloperidol Smy fability Market and the second seco	Haloperidol is a medication that will help if you have psychosis, schizophrenia or mania.
	Haloperidol can sometimes be called a different name like Serenace and Haldol.
	Haloperidol is usually taken as tablets capsules and liquid medication.

Where do I get Haloperidol?

You can only get this medication with a prescription.
The doctor or consultant
 Will ask you questions about your health May also check your blood pressure Will ask you if you are taking other medication

How do I take Haloperidol?



The doctor will talk to you about how much Haloperidol you need to take.

The doctor will tell you how to take your Haloperidol. You need to take Haloperidol for some time so that it works best.



You will usually take Haloperidol in the morning and in the evening. Sometimes you may also need to take Haloperidol at lunchtime.




If you forget to take your medication you must tell your carer and ask your doctor for advice.



You should not stop taking your medication suddenly as this could make you feel unwell.

What is not good about Haloperidol?



There are some health problems that people can get when they take Haloperidol.

These problems are called **side effects** but not everyone gets them.



- Feeling tired
- Constipation
- Headache
- Feel thirsty
- Feel hungry and putting on weight



You should eat a healthy diet and drink more water or fruit juice.

Usually these side effects go away after a few weeks



You will need to speak to your doctor if you

- Have a rash on your skin
- Feel your hands shake
- Feel stiff and restless
- Problems with your breasts
- Feel unwell

What other things do I need to talk to the doctor about?



You should talk to your doctor if

- You are worried about your medication.
- You want to know how much alcohol is safe to drink when taking medication.
- You are planning to have a baby.
