Why am I in Alderley Unit?



You are in Alderley Unit under section 3 of the Mental Health Act 1983.

3 registered professionals think that you have a mental disorder and you need to be in Alderley Unit to get treatment and care.

How long will I be in Alderley Unit?



The section 3 will be reviewed after 6 months, then after another 6 months and then every year.

This is so that you can get the treatment you need.

If you want time off the ward you must ask the staff.



The staff must agree that you can have time off the ward.

This is called section 17 leave.

If you leave the ward and do not ask the staff you can be brought back.

What happens next?



The person in charge of your care will tell you when they think you are well enough to leave Alderley Unit.



The staff looking after you will talk to you about any treatment they think you need.

What if I want to leave Alderley Unit?

Your nearest relative can also write to the hospital managers to say that they want you to leave Alderley Unit.

You can ask the tribunal to say that you can leave Alderley Unit.

What is the Tribunal?



The tribunal is an independent group of people.

They decide if you should be allowed to leave Alderley Unit.

They will have a meeting with you and staff from Alderley Unit.

You can ask a solicitor to write to the Tribunal for you and help you.

The staff can give you the names of solicitors who can help you.

Changing your nearest relative




You may not want this person to be your nearest relative.


You can ask the court to change your nearest relative.
