Making a referral to the service

When you contact Adult Social Services we will ask for some details. The Screening Team will then contact you. The Screening Team is a group of social workers who will assess your circumstances.

The Team will do one of three things:

- 1. Offer advice and information
- 2. Refer you to re-enablement for assessment
- 3. Refer you for assessment to the CLDT team

About the Community Learning Disability Team

The role of the Community Learning Disability Team is to support people with a learning disability to lead full and healthy lives within the local community.

The team is made up of health professionals and social workers who specialise in working with people with learning disabilities.

The team members work together to plan and provide a range of services for people who are in need.

The team also provides specialist information, advice and training for family carer and support staff.

Health Facilitators

Health facilitators are nurses who specialise in working with people with learning disabilities to access general health services.

A large part of their role is to provide training to GPs, hospital staff and carers to raise awareness of the health needs of people with learning disabilities.

They can also work with people who have complex health needs.

Community Learning Disability Nurses

Community learning disability nurses have a range of knowledge and skills which they use to provide specialist healthcare, health assessments, Health Action Plans, advice, support, and treatment for people with learning disabilities.

They can also offer training in areas such as Autism, mental health and medication, complex health needs, challenging behaviour, sexual health and personal relationships.

Psychiatrist

The psychiatrist provides assessment, diagnosis and treatment for people with learning disabilities who may experience difficulties with their mental health. They may advise a person's GP about prescribing medication and monitor the person's progress.

Clinical Psychologist

The clinical psychologist will work directly or indirectly to help people with learning disabilities and their carers understand and cope with the psychological problems a person may have. Psychologists can help to identify the best types of support that might reduce any distress and improve the person's quality of life.

Speech & Language Therapists

Speech & language therapists assess all aspects of communication. They help people with learning disabilities to improve their communication and provide advice and training to their carers. They also identify and provide treatment and support to people with (dysphagia) difficulties with eating, drinking and/or swallowing.

Physiotherapist

The physiotherapist works with people who have physical difficulties. They can provide support and advice in most aspects of movement, specialist seating and positioning, posture care, mobility and respiratory care.

Occupational Therapist

The Occupational Therapist's help people to be as independent as they can be in their everyday activities. They assess and identify their skills and help them maintain and develop skills. They give advice to people and their carers regarding help to participate in activities which are meaningful and purposeful. They also aim to help people manage their environment and make sure their surroundings meet their needs.

Autism Support Co-ordinator

The Autism Support Co-ordinator role is to link with local people and agencies to raise awareness of the needs with adults with autism and to look at what support they need. They will work with specialist service providers such as the Community Learning Disability Team, but also with mainstream services such as G.Ps, colleges, leisure services, libraries, the Police as well as groups supporting people with Autism and their carers.

Participation & Development Worker

The Participation & Development Worker supports service users and their carers to be involved in and develop their own health care. This can include consultation, information and involvement in representing the experiences of people in dealing with the Health and Social Care system.

Social Workers

Social workers offer advice, information, support and assistance to people with learning disabilities and their carers. They assess complex social situations and promote individual rights in these situations. They also help and support people who may be experiencing abuse.

Transition Co-ordinator

The Transition Co-ordinator supports the process of planning to meet the needs of young people in transition and supports the day to day management of transition cases into adult services. They also provide a central point of contact for all the relevant teams, professionals and agencies supporting young people in transition.

Safeguarding

Trafford's Safeguarding Partnership works together to deliver a co-ordinated service to support individuals. Every person has a right to live a life free from abuse and neglect and Trafford's multi-agency Safeguarding Partnership has zero tolerance to all forms of abuse.
