

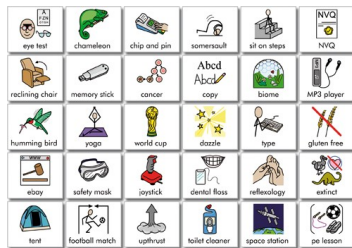
What will happen after the assessment?

The speech and language therapist may work with you and your family or staff to make communication easier.

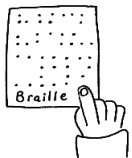


They may do things like

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What is a communication assessment?

- how you talk to people
- how you listen to people

What will happen at the assessment?

The speech and language therapist will show you some photographs or pictures.



You can have someone from your family or your staff with you at the assessment.

The speech and language therapist will talk to your family or staff about your talking and listening.
